FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

Call to Order/Roll Call

Mr. Kantarzhi called the meeting to order at 10:32 a.m.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Presentation of Engineer's Report

Mr. Stokes stated that the Engineer's Report remains largely unchanged. There was an update to the legal to be included and a few minor updates.

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Ms. Schuster asked for a map. Ms. Cerbone stated the preference is a color-coded map reflecting ownership and/or responsibility of the various improvements, by entity.

Mr. Stokes will prepare and provide a map.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Presentation of Amended and Restated Master Special Assessment Methodology Report

Mr. Kantarzhi presented the Amended and Restated Master Special Assessment Methodology Report and highlighted the following:

- It was necessary to prepare the Amended and Restated Methodology Report due to the Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) change for the Townhomes. There were no changes to the acreage or unit counts.
- On Page 15, Table 4 reflects the Townhomes with an ERU weighting of 0.7; it was previously 0.4. There is no change to the ERU weightings for the other unit types. The total ERU amount for the Townhomes is now 148.4; it was previously 84.4.
- On Page 16, Table 5 reflects the change in assessment apportionment. For the Townhomes, the total cost allocation is now \$6.9 million; it was previously \$4.2 million. The total bond assessment apportionment is 9.9 million; it was previously \$6 million. And the bond assessment apportionment, per unit, is now \$46,734; whereas it was previously \$28,600. The maximum annual Debt Service payment per unit is now \$4,676.04; it was previously \$2,862.41.

On MOTION by Ms. Schuster and seconded by Ms. Kane, with all in favor, the Amended and Restated Master Special Assessment Methodology Report, in substantial form, was approved.

On MOTION by Ms. Kane and seconded by Ms. Schuster, with all in favor, the Engineer's Report, in substantial form, was approved.
